

Black History Month

February is recognized all month-long as Black History Month.

It was Carter G. Woodson, the "Father of Black History," who first set out to promote and educate people about Black history and culture.

Born in New Canton, Virginia, in 1875, Carter G. Woodson would never see the first Black History Month.

Recognizing throughout his studies the scarcity of African Americans in the nation's curriculum, he chose to stem the tide and bring to the forefront those lost voices; founded in 1915 the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (now the Association for the Study of African American Life).

Seeking to bring even more stories of African Americans to light, in 1926, Woodson founded the first Negro History Week. This was timed in February to coincide with President Abraham Lincoln's and Fredrick Douglass' birthdays - both men were symbols of freedom. It wasn't until 1976 that President Gerald Ford extended the observation to a full month - one honoring the contributions of Black Americans to this day.
