<u>Goals for the year</u>: Our main goals are <u>outreach</u> and <u>organizing SPS substitutes</u>, and preparing for bargaining a new contract. We will also focus on addressing Substitute concerns through labor/management meetings, representation, grievances, and planning PD.

Meetings and Events:

<u>SSA Board Meeting</u> (May 30) - We drafted a letter requesting more substitute representation on the bargaining team, and we were successful - there are now 3 members (Stan Strasner joins Molly O'Neil and me). We also need the voice of an experienced IA! We also discussed getting support for sub-planned and sub-produced professional development, outreach to subs for the picnic, and the bargaining survey results.

<u>SSA Year End Celebration</u> (June 7) - Our annual picnic in Woodland Park - over 60 subs and friends attended, our best turnout ever! Thank you to Kim VanAtta and Monica Menchaca who came to wish us well. Temple Robinson, our UniServ on-leave, was present - in spirit - with pictures of baby Eden. Thanks to Jan Bowersox who provided table decorations and door prizes (living flower baskets, obtained from the annual Nathan Hale plant sale) and Karin Engstrom, David Posner and Pat Robertson who helped plan and showed up early. We presented the bargaining survey results and had a good time! We did not elect more new ARs for 2018-19 nor did we vote on our proposed bylaws change, which expands our board of directors from 8 to 12 members.

<u>Labor/Management Meetings</u> (May 22, June 6) - We are using this time for "interest-based bargaining" to work on discipline issues. Both parties (subs and district) realize the current situation is unsustainable. Too many ill-founded incident reports are written, and almost always a report is filed without first checking with the sub to find out their side of the story.

<u>Sub-Friendly Presentations</u> (May 23) - The Sub Association presented the awards for the Sub Friendly Schools to the School Board: Greenwood, Leschi and Rainier View Elementary Schools, McClure and Hamilton Middle Schools, Orca K-8, and Ballard and Franklin High Schools.

Current grievances/actions:

- **SEA Bargaining** A session focusing on subs will be scheduled before the end of June. You will be invited to attend to share your story of why subs are important!
- Payroll issues All accumulated sick leave should be showing up on our pay stubs: daily sub, long-term sub and
 FTE. They are carried over year to year and may be used interchangeably. However there are no plans to make
 the rest of the pay warrant readable. If you cannot figure out your pay stub please contact me and also submit
 a complaint to the Department of Labor and Industries:

- Did you know... If you are a cert in a 90+ day position (i.e. you are earning TRI) and you work through the end of the year, your district-paid insurance benefits are continued for an extra month (till the end of October).
- Sick leave The SEA will be voting to approve the Sick Leave MOU that we negotiated with the District in December and January. If a daily sub wakes up sick, they can access their sick leave w/o having to take a job.
- Getting blocked for calling in sick. If you drop a job in AESOP within 12 hours, you must contact the sub office and school, else you might get a letter that blocks you from the school. Way to treat subs with respect!
- Early Release Wednesdays. These are not early release days for subs. We are expected to work the hours posted in AESOP which should reflect an entire day. Subs may participate in building PD if appropriate. If not we can work on the on-line "safe schools" trainings, required yearly, or ask the office how you can help.
