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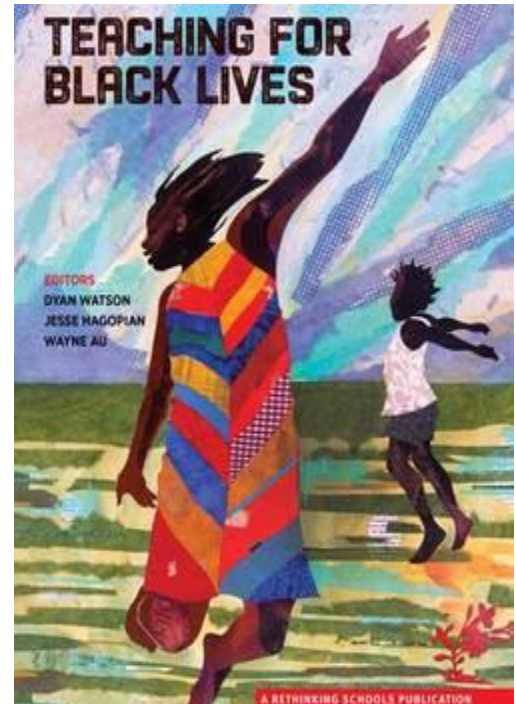

Ready to teach Ethnic Studies?

To teach Ethnic Studies, educators should be prepared to learn about, teach about, and facilitate discussions about racial identity, systems of power and oppression, how people and communities of color have resisted oppression and liberated themselves from racist systems, and how to guide students to act in their lives and various communities to dismantle white supremacy.

This six-part series has been developed to prepare teachers to do these things! Racial Equity Literacy will help educators understand what it means to be “racial equity literate” and how their own identities and positionality in the classroom impacts their own teaching and their students’ learning. Culturally Responsive Teaching prepares educators to facilitate authentic, student-centered, collaborative classrooms that are culturally relevant. Ethnic Studies will dispel misconceptions about the nature of Ethnic Studies content and provide tools and guidance on how to locate and/or create preK-12 Ethnic Studies content for all disciplines.
