Goals for the year: Our main goals are outreach and organizing SPS substitutes.

We will also focus on addressing Substitute concerns through labor/management meetings, representation, grievances, and planning PD.

TRI FLASH (phase 2)! - District was premature. 2012-13 TRI money will show up in the December paycheck, not November as they had previously stated. We will believe it when we see it. We still have no idea when they will deal with the "second list" of subs who may be owed TRI. They asked us to re-send this list and we did, a month ago, and so far all we hear is crickets.

Professional Development: We are planning for a PD on Feb. 1, the day between semesters, to focus on diversity training. More details will be provided as they develop.

Meetings and Events:

SSA Association Rep Training is tentatively planned for two days, on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 3 and 4. There will be a strategy session, planning for organizing, and specific trainings on advocacy and organizing.

Labor/Management Meeting - We are waiting to hear back from the district re: scheduling a second L/M meeting. Sub Shortage Task Force - Next meeting is scheduled for Nov. 30.

AESOP issues include prearranged jobs being dropped or not entered, difficulty finding secondary jobs. The district's new practice of not allowing subs to drop/reschedule jobs within 18 hours before the job, will be renegotiated with the Union.

Until the issue of what a "half day" consists of is negotiated, we recommend that cert. subs who work 3.75 hours or more advocate for getting paid for a full day, as stated in our contract.
