I'm running for SEA president to center racial justice, fight for fully-funded and safe schools, and hold the district accountable to its own rhetoric and policies.

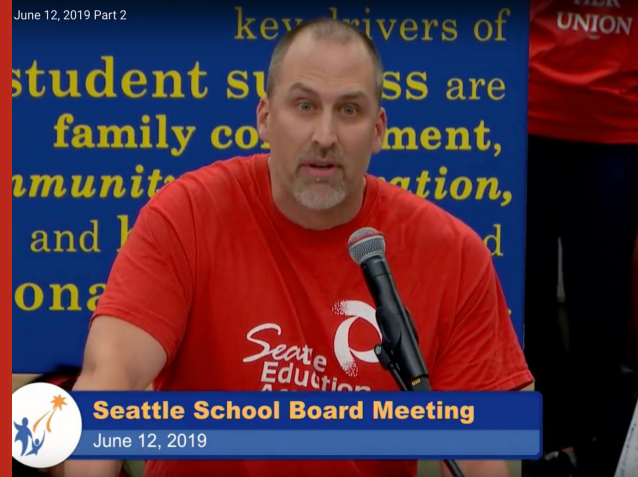
With 20 years of SPS and SEA experience, I know that a stronger, empowered union community is the clearest pathway to achieve these goals.

Building relationships with communities within our city and across the state, I have played key roles in organizing for Ethnic Studies in Seattle and Black Lives Matter at School actions, not to mention supporting educators unfairly targeted by district leadership. My SEA experience includes serving as building rep for six years and delegate to both the WEA and NEA Representative Assemblies.

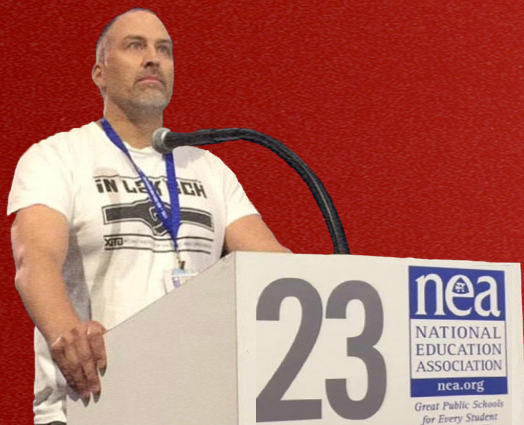
