Seattle Schools have been trying to find ways to reduce the number of members and replace them with inexperienced teachers who cost less. Futhermore, our union is also siding with the district on this issue. I was personally asked by our past president if I would be willing to give up my position for a younger person of color. He knew I am Natvive American. I am also running to make our schools safer. Teachers and staff are being injured at work and the district are not being held responsible. Lastly I want to change the displacement procedure. Teachers should not have to go through the interview process. They should be placed in open positions of their choice. Principals should not be allowed to hold off advertising positions until the displacement timeline is over.	
Theo Moriarty	Our union is based on our combined strengths and right now much of that strength is being wasted due to a lack of focused organization. Our goals are too important to let issues slip away when they are eminently fixable. I want to bring a modern and intense upgrade to our union. We need to upgrade our structure: We need a separate monthly WEA-PAC meeting. We can then focus solely on critical social issues such as BLM and use our WEAPAC funds to fund our actions rather than holding it over to give back to WEA. Second, we need to focus our Contract RAs on enforcement at the building level. We need specific guidelines written into practical manuals for reps to use. We need to ensure that as an organization we have strength rather than relying on the personal strength of our already far overloaded building Reps and Members. Part of this contract enforcement is that Uniserv reps need to be in their buildings once per month and attend building union meetings. A central organizing portal that each Rep can log into for building level emails, consultations, and grievances/concerns shared across the union for pattern recognition and wide-reaching solutions.
