

Seattle Substitutes Association Report – May, 2017

Goals for the year: Our main goals are **outreach and organizing SPS substitutes.**

We will also focus on addressing Substitute concerns through labor/management meetings, representation, grievances, and planning PD.

Meetings and Events:

SSA General Meeting (March 23). We elected Josh Harper as a new Association Rep for the substitutes. Welcome Josh! We heard a presentation by Veronica Gallardo on immigrant rights and our obligations and school district policy around ICE enforcement. We had a vigorous discussion on whether or not to vote for a one day strike / walkout on May 1, to protest lack of legislative action on funding, and to protest attacks on teachers/labor across this country, and to stand in solidarity with immigrant communities. Then we voted and the ballots were collected and turned in to the SEA.

Labor/Management Meeting (April 20). We reviewed two proposed MOUs (memoranda of understanding) regarding timeline for dropping assignments under AESOP, and making sure that a certificated sub with minimal experience and education won't be earning LESS under the state salary schedule (16+ days on the job) than as a daily sub. There was an acknowledgment about being paid for a full day for jobs over 3.5 hrs (certs). We discussed attempts to meet with administrators to resolve problems before an incident report is filed. The 1.1 FTE grievance settlement (RBHS) is being reviewed. Do they need to hire all those new subs? - yes, according to the district, because last-minute jobs are still unfilled. This is not a south-end problem but persists throughout the system.

WEA Representative Assembly (April 13-15). Several subs attended the annual WEA RA in Spokane, including Peter, Jan, Karin, Stan Strasner, Matt Maley, and Marty Wall. We proposed, and the RA passed, a New Business Item (NBI 17) to encourage the WEA to continue their initiative to increase the membership of subs within locals in the WEA: "That WEA will continue to involve substitutes by forming a committee of interested leaders to continue investigating how best to encourage substitute educators' involvement within locals and the WEA. That WEA will also provide ongoing substitute organizing updates to Council Presidents and the WEA Board for distribution to local affiliates, including periodic posts on the WEA website."
