Don't forget the Primary Election!

Are you a registered voter? If not, you have until July 3rd to register online or by mail. After that, you will need to go to the County Elections office to register in person through July 24th. Ballots will be mailed July 12th and drop boxes will open on the 13th. El;ection day is August 1st.

Go to: http://kingcounty.gov/depts/elections.aspx if you live in King County. Each county has its own Elections office – so Google your county elections for the correct website.

On the King County website, link to "My Voter Guide". Fill out the information and it will provide you with what is on your ballot and links to all the candidates' and ballot measures' websites. What a perfect way to research your decisions.

The City of Seattle mailed out 4 \$25 Democracy Vouchers to designate for your candidates. They are good from 1-3 to 11-30-2017. Use them! Go to http://www.seattle.gov/democracyvoucher to see the list of participating candidates.

There are 21 people running for Seattle Mayor. Open City Council seats, County and Seattle School Board. It is exciting to see so many people interested in serving. Work on your candidate's campaign—they all need support.

Sign up for the Substitute Schoology Page:
